

Consistent Implementation: the integrated model for standards development and consistent implementation

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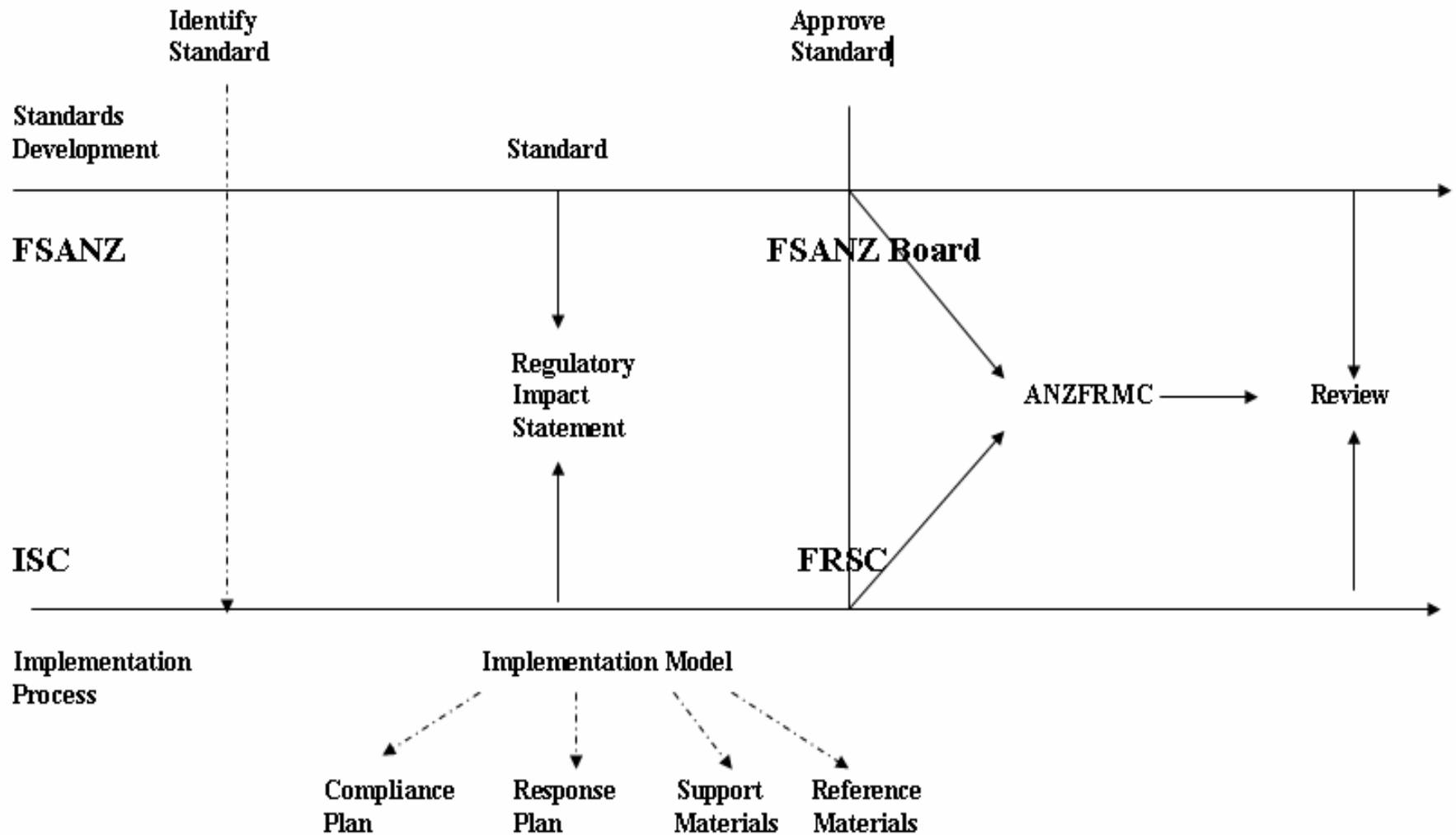
Why is there a need for an integrated model?

- Current standards are developed as outcome based standards.
- Generally 2 yr timeframe is provided for implementation.
- New standards do not have compliance arrangements.
- Piloted via Primary Production and Processing Standard Egg Standard.

The integrated model

- Concept: National food standards and their implementation packages should be developed together.
- Expedite national RIS process.
- Ministers to be presented with a package.
- Ministers are aware of the implementation package when approving a new standard.

The integrated model



Piloting of the model

- Pilot: Eggs – FRSC approved.
- ISC Egg Working Group.
- Working Group has developed a draft compliance plan.
- Compliance plan is a statement of intent by jurisdictions.
- Minimal approach required for industry to meet compliance.

Consultation

- Preliminary exposure to Egg SDC.
- ISC to release the draft compliance plan for consultation within FSANZ process.

The next steps

- Information from consultation to be analysed.
- Completion of implementation guidelines.
- Evaluation of the pilot concept.
- Communications strategy in the process of being developed.
- Bringing the package together.
